In-Car Payment Systems

Convenience is king, and in-car payment systems that integrate payment features into a vehicle's infotainment system make it ultra-easy to make contactless payments for goods and services. Enabled with internet connectivity and digital wallets, these systems use secure authentication and data encryption to allow you to pay for all sorts of things on the go:

Companies in the United States and abroad have strengthened their internal protocols; third-party audits have become more intensive; and suppliers have prioritized security checks to mitigate the risks of data breaches, ransomware, and remote system hijacking.

The heightened scrutiny may not be all good, though.

Some experts warn that it could lead to higher costs for consumers and repair challenges if manufacturers' operating systems lock out independent repair shops from accessing diagnostics and other functions.

Services on a Subscription Basis

Enter the reimaging of car ownership and access to value-added features! A mindset shift from "owning" to "using" is emerging, primarily among younger generations and urban drivers who want access to a car without the headaches of ownership.

Subscription models that bundle vehicle use with maintenance and insurance offer convenience, no-surprise billing, and the flexibility to switch cars more often. Car manufacturers also offer subscriptions that grant access to specific features, such as self-driving software, remote start, climate control, acceleration boost, and enhanced navigation.

While paying for new, value-added features via a subscription might seem a sweet deal, car buyers might feel taken

advantage of if car makers charge them on a recurring basis to unlock standard amenities (like heated seats) already built into their vehicles.

4. Software-Defined Vehicles

As manufacturers integrate cloud-based software to control nearly every aspect of a car's operation and features, vehicles are evolving into devices akin to smartphones on wheels.

Some positive implications for drivers:

- Reduces the need to bring vehicles to the shop, as some upgrades and recalls can be addressed remotely.
- Allows for faster turnaround on installing performance enhancements and cybersecurity updates.
- Enables earlier detection of potential issues and maintenance needs through 24/7 real-time diagnostics.

On the flip side, not all automotive shops have mechanics trained in a variety of software systems, nor the diagnostic tools necessary to troubleshoot

when vehicles with advanced technology encounter issues that can't be resolved by pushing an update or patch.

5. Unprecedented Personalization

Artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning will continue to impact all facets of our lives—including our vehicles. New cars and trucks equipped with AI-assisted driving support can "learn" a driver's habits and recognize and assess surroundings to recommend and adjust settings to better ensure safety and comfort.

For example:

- Seat height, music selection, inside temperature, and other settings tailored to your preferences.
- Route suggestions based on traffic or weather conditions.
- Superior speech recognition and contextual response abilities, so you can ask questions and give commands as you would if talking to a real person.

Rather than replace human drivers, AI-assisted driving systems interact with them, empowering them by predicting

their actions, providing real-time guidance, and responding to their requests.

Be aware of the potential disadvantages as well. AI can boost efficiency and safety, but it increases data privacy and cybersecurity risks, distracted driving, complicated system malfunctions, and complex liability concerns. Responsible implementation and stricter regulations are needed to lessen the incidence and impact of those challenges.

Recipe from Kurt Roberts

This is a good use for any small pieces of salmon you have as leftovers or the end of a bag of frozen salmon fillets. If you're using leftover cooked salmon, you can just combine steps 2 and 3.

Sometimes I'll throw in a cup of frozen peas for variety.

Ingredients:

- 8-10 Ounces of Salmon - trimmings work well here
- 1 Container of Cherry Tomatoes (16oz)
- 1 Onion, chopped
- 3 cloves of garlic, thinly sliced
- 1/2 c Dry White Wine
- A large handful of fresh basil leaves, julienned (or torn if you're not feeling fancy) and divided in half
- 1 tsp Crushed Red Pepper Flakes
- 1 tbsp Dried Oregano or a handful of fresh leaves
- 1/4 c Cream
- 1 Box Angel Hair Pasta
- Salt and Pepper

**Directions:**

1. In a large pan with a lid, cook the onion over medium heat in olive oil.
2. As the onion starts to soften, add the garlic, pepper flakes, oregano and the salmon. Break the salmon up as it cooks so that it will spread through the sauce.
3. After the salmon is cooked, add the cherry tomatoes and deglaze with the wine. Cover the pan with the lid and let the tomatoes burst, stirring occasionally. You can help them along by pressing on them with your spoon. Somewhere in this process you'll want to cook the pasta according to the box directions.
4. As the tomatoes burst and release their juices, reduce to low heat and add half the basil. Stir the cream in, and heat until warm. Salt and pepper to taste.
5. Serve over the pasta and garnish with the other half the basil.
